## N.E.C.

The N.E.C. met on the 13th June.

It was decided to allocate around 5 £80 of the funds to the Alexandra Palace stand. This would be used to pay for our site and the production of literature and stand decoration.

The M.A.F.F. had acknowledged our submission which would be given full consideration before going to Ministers. The implementation date could not be predicted. Branches should supply the B.L.O. with names and addresses of M.P.s etc to be lobbyed

The Treasurer reported that the Society value was £436.40 of which £247.00 was stock. He proposed to write off £29.58 of stock to balance the books. This consisted of 9 sets of cuff-links. 46 Christmas Cards from 1975 and 141 Cards from 1976. This action was approved.

It was agreed to produce a Christmas Card this year with a traditional greeting, irrespective of h the design. It was hoped that this would be acceptable to buyers.

The N.E.C. are to purchase £10 worth of badges from Wantz Branch for sale at Alexandra Palace.

It is hoped to organise a social event in October.
